Section 2 - Provision C.2 Reporting Municipal Operations

Program Highlights and Evaluation

Highlight/summarize activities for reporting year:

Summary:

The Town continues to utilize a Customer Relationship Management (CRM) an on-line system which allows the public to report concerns or potential hazards and provides staff with a comprehensive electronic system to track all maintenance work orders. The CRM assists our pollution prevention efforts by allowing residents as well as staff to quickly report issues and serving as a systematic, detailed tracking system. For example, in 2021/2022 Fiscal Year:

- Spills: 0 traffic accidents were cleaned up
- Illegal Dumping: Staff responded to 35 illegal dumping instances.
- Creek Maintenance: 14 work orders entered, with work primarily consisting of manual removal of obstructions from flow lines.
- Drain inlets: Inspected 970 drain inlets and cleaned as needed, removing 45 cubic yards of debris.
- Curb Miles Swept: 10,196 swept throughout Town.
- Inspected 6.1 linear miles of creeks and ditches
- Total amount of debris collected 89 cubic yards

The Town's sweeping contractor uses an efficient regenerative air sweepers for sweeping activities throughout the Town. Maintenance staff checks the contractors' operations monthly to ensure its work is complete and to specifications. This contract includes all public parking lots maintained by the Town of Danville. The sweeping debris generated is consolidated at the Town's Service Center maintenance yard. Street sweeping debris piles are picked up two-three times a week, depending on the season and sweeping needs. The Town continues to work with the same street sweeping contractor, whose contract will be reviewed and revised on June 30, 2024.

Town maintenance staff inspects 6.1 lineal miles of creeks and ditches each year for obstructions and general clean-up activities. All creeks are walked, and obstructions are noted. Town staff or a contractor is used remove obstructions in the creeks without herbicides/pesticides used, all trash and debris are picked up by in-house crews, or contractors and the work is recorded in the Town's electronic CRM system. The total amount of debris collected from creeks and channels this year was 89 cubic yards.

Customer Request Management (CRM) has helped with the volumes reported since implementation of this system several years ago. Maintenance staff reports the new system is more accurate because information is input daily, whereas it was previously input every two weeks. Staff has found with this increase in reporting, the system is a more accurate reflection of Town efforts. Roadside trash and debris are picked up and hauled to the Town's Service Center for proper disposal and the quantities are recorded. All green waste collected by the Town's Maintenance staff is recycled and the volume of trash and debris picked up is quantified and recorded in the Towns' electronic CRM system.

The Town continues its garbage/recycling collection agreement, which became effective 3/1/15. This contract continues to provide for more pick-ups at the Town's Service Center which continues to keep the maintenance yard clean. This contract provides an individual schedule for each Town facility where garbage is collected and is based on the needs of that facility. The increased frequency of the amount of trash picked up in the downtown area is helping to reduce trash loads and the contractor appears to supply the Town with more accurate accounting of debris picked up as well.

Six Maintenance Services staff members attended a course taught by biologist Chris Rogers, Per the Town's Streambed Alteration Agreement with the Department of Fish and Wildlife. These key personnel were trained and certified on how to identify local species habitat in Town's creeks and waterways. These staffers continue to be responsible for inspection of creeks before any work is to be done to ensure that no habitats are destroyed. Town-maintained creeks have not been cleared as in past years due to Fish and Wildlife regulations. However, inspections of creeks continue and all trash, vegetation/debris that obstruct/limit flow capacity are removed. No chemical applications were conducted in any Town maintained creeks.

The Town of Danville continues its commitment to reducing over-watering and water use through use of its Central Irrigation System on Town-owned sites which includes the five major parks (Osage Station, Sycamore Valley, Diablo Vista, Oak Hill and Hap Magee Ranch) and other smaller park sites as well as large turf areas along the roadsides. The Town continues to work with EBMUD to identify water requirements for Town-maintained areas, utilizing EBMUD's Water Smart Program and information from the water billings to check water usage. This helps from year to year to confirm water usage based on annual Evapo-transpiration rate (ET). This information is used so proper irrigation adjustments can be made. The Town continues to use using daily Evapo-transpiration (ET) information to adjust the watering schedules at 33 sites and ET information is used to make seasonal and weather-related water adjustments. The Town continues its testing of a newer technology that uses underground soil moisture sensors to determine irrigation based on exactly how much water each site needs.

The Town continues its on-going program to identify areas where either drought tolerant or native plant material could potentially replace plant material that require more water. Every year, as the budget allows and approved by the Town Council, higher water use landscaping is gradually replaced with drought tolerant/low water requiring species. Grass has been removed from all Town-maintained medians and median narrow median noses and replace with either cobbles or mulched to reduce water and eliminated chemical usage. Over an acre of grass was removed from various sites this year.

The Town's landscape maintenance contractors are Bay Friendly certified, and the Town contracts include language that makes Integrated Pest Management (IPM) a requirement. Town staff does not do any pest management; however, the Town's Maintenance Services Supervisor has attended IPM Guidance Manual Training to learn new information for the Town's IPM program. The Town also contracts with a company to do IPM structural pest control for all Town-owned buildings/facilities. For more information on IPM methods the Town implements see Section C.9 of this report.

Summary:
 Continuing education for the property owners to understand the importance in maintaining the vegetation in the IMP. Provide direction for individual homeowners to properly maintain IMP, while having them understand the obligation of the O&M attached to the property. On one site the irrigation system malfunction and vegetation has died. The Town is presently working with the HOA's landscape contractor to remedy the problem. IMPs in higher trash areas in the downtown continue to do well at capturing trash.

<p>Summary:</p> <p>The methodology of counting projects (20%/year) for reporting purposes is not well defined in the MRP. There could be an abnormal amount of IMP inspections each year when a development project (no matter how many IMPs are in it, or whether each lot has their own IMP or just one for an entire project is approved, it can drastically throw off the count). Danville has been advocating a change in this methodology since MRP 2.0 was adopted.</p>

<p>Summary:</p> <p>Applicants for development approvals for projects creating or replacing more than 2,500 square feet but less than 10,000 square feet of impervious area, and single-family homes creating or replacing more than 2,500 square feet of impervious area, are required to submit a Stormwater Control Plan for a Small Land Development Project that meets the criteria in Appendix C of the Contra Costa Clean Water Program's <i>Stormwater C.3 Guidebook</i>. Appendix C includes minimum specifications for runoff reduction measures.</p> <p>BASMAA prepared standard specifications in four fact sheets regarding the site design measures listed in Provision C.3.i, as a resource for Permittees. The Contra Costa Clean Water Program adopted a December 1, 2012, addendum to the Stormwater C.3 Guidebook, 7th Edition, which the Town has adopted and utilizes for all such applications. The addendum, "Preparing a Stormwater Control Plan for a Small Land Development Project," includes step-by-step instructions, a project data form, and standard specifications for runoff reduction measures. The Town of Danville's stormwater ordinance requires all applications for development approvals comply with the MRP and the most recent version of the Stormwater C.3 Guidebook. Danville modified local policies/procedures and forms/checklists to require all applicable projects approved after December 1, 2012 to implement at least one of the site design measures listed in Provision C.3.i. This year, two planners were trained, including how to review and approve the C.3 Small Land Development Projects, and how that process differs from regular C.3 regulated projects. Continued</p>

education for all staff is helpful to make sure the approval process for all C.3 projects is followed. This is accomplished one-on-one on a personal basis to review individual projects.

Summary:

Town stormwater and Engineering staff attended the C.3 Green Infrastructure Planning Workshop, which was put on by the CCCWP. It included instruction on preparation of Green Infrastructure Plans for Permittee staff and a review of materials created by CCCWP to assist the Permittees in preparing their Green Infrastructure Plans, as well as a panel discussion.

The CIP process includes coordination by representatives from several departments to review, update, recommend and include new infrastructure projects each year. Members of the internal CIP group have been educated on the meaning of and requirements for Green Infrastructure. In addition, Green Infrastructure planning was discussed at the Engineering Division staff meeting where members could receive information and ask questions.

The list of potential GI projects in the Town's CIP was reviewed and updated for FY 2020/21 and presented to the Town Council at a public hearing and approved. Since adoption of the CIP, additional GI projects were identified by the Stormwater Manager and the City Engineer through the UrbanSim modeling process. Several additional projects that have potential for GI were selected to be included in the Town's GI Plan. These projects are primarily GI projects to be considered for future years. The City Engineer will add these projects in the following years. In addition, the City Engineer proposes to add \$10,000/year to a fund for GI improvements. It is intended to accumulate monies over several years and use them to enhance a CIP with green infrastructure.

The Town's Green Infrastructure Plan was reviewed publicly noticed meetings to review, discuss and receive input. It was reviewed at a Town Council Study Session and heard at a Town Council regularly scheduled meeting. Town staff initially utilized the BASMAA May 6, 2016, document, "Guidance for Identifying Green Infrastructure Potential in Municipal Capital Improvement Projects" to determine what current projects may be eligible to become GI projects. The CCCWP program previously conducted a GIS study to find potential GI projects for the Stormwater Resource Plan throughout the County. Danville Stormwater staff reviewed this list of hundreds of projects for potential inclusion and/or re-prioritization in our GI Plan. A few new projects were identified during this process that may be considered for inclusion in future years. Also, this list was compared to the Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) list which casts a broad net on many potential CIP projects. The CIP list will be re-reviewed as the process continues each fiscal year.

Summary:

The Town of Danville contracts with Central Contra Costa Sanitary District (CCCCSD) for business inspections annually. Town staff reviews the inspection program with CCCSD district staff to coordinate inspections and address any new items that the Town wants addressed. CCCSD provides effective prompt service for callouts when field issues/observations arise or when Town staff receive complaints. Typical response time is usually within one day. The CCCSD business list is reviewed, updated, and prioritized yearly. The schedule and pace of inspections is also reviewed.

Town Economic Development staff continue to update and produce a list of businesses that are new or relocated. This updated list is forwarded to CCCSD which they use to update CCCSD's data base. This information helps to better determine the correct number and type of businesses that need inspections in Danville. The new accounting of business changes is proving to be a great resource for our Business Inspection program. The Town's stormwater Coordinator/ inspector previously attended 6/22/22 Inspection Workshop training in Contra Costa County this year. In addition, CCCSD inspectors also received training per Attachment C.4.e. - POTW Training.

Town staff voluntarily participates in the Commercial/Industrial MOC Workgroup of the CCCWP in addition to other committees. Also, please refer to the C.4. Industrial and Commercial Site Controls section of the CCCWP's FY 21-22 Annual Report for a description of activities of the countywide program.

Comments:

Most of the reports are received by citizens over the phone, through the Town's "Danville Connect" on-line service request system, by police or by staff observations. Generally, complaints are routed to the appropriate person/department to be dealt with as soon as possible. Sometimes a coordinated enforcement response is necessary by utilizing the Town's Maintenance Department, Code Enforcement Officer and/or the Town's Stormwater Coordinator depending on the situation. When non-stormwater pollutants could potentially discharge into the drainage system, an immediate clean-up is required, the site is monitored as the clean-up is occurring. Letters and/or follow-up enforcement and education is conducted to resolve the problem in a timely manner so that it will not happen again.

The Town continues to utilize a Customer Relationship Management (CRM) an on-line system which allows the public to report concerns or potential hazards and provides staff with a comprehensive electronic system to track all maintenance work orders. The CRM assists our pollution prevention efforts by allowing residents as well as staff to quickly report issues and serving as a systematic, detailed tracking system. For example, in 2020/2021 Fiscal Year:

- Spills: 0 traffic accidents were cleaned up

Most of the reports are received by citizens over the phone, through the Town's "Danville Connect" on-line service request system, by police or by staff observations. Generally, complaints are routed to the appropriate person/department to be dealt with as soon as possible. Sometimes a coordinated enforcement response is necessary by utilizing the Town's Maintenance Department, Code Enforcement Officer and/or the Town's Stormwater Coordinator depending on the situation. When non-stormwater pollutants could potentially discharge into the drainage system, an immediate clean-up is required, the site is monitored as the clean-up is occurring. Letters and/or follow-up enforcement and education is conducted to resolve the problem in a timely manner so that it will not happen again.

Description:

The Town's grading inspector catalogs inspection data in weekly/monthly inspection reports utilizing a fillable C.3 Construction Inspection Checklist for each stage of construction. Most inspections include observations on site maintenance and to ensure that sites are ready for Storm Water events. Installation of C.3 improvements are inspected at various intervals of construction and require sign-off by an inspector before proceeding to the next construction step. Inspectors will continue to utilize the Town's C.3 Construction Inspection Checklist for each stage of construction for C.3 facilities. The checklist is a very helpful tool for each stage of construction. The contractor and staff know what is expected and how to plan for upcoming inspections.

The Town has developed a consistent format for site inspections. This is a work in progress as most of the Town's inspection staff has retired. As new inspection staff are hired, they are trained on the consistent format developed for site inspections

The attitude of contractors to comply with erosion control and other stormwater requirements has improved over past years. Typically, private companies e.g., SWIMS are hired specifically for site management and stormwater control on larger project sites. In general, it is the smaller contractors on small single-family residences that require significantly more staff attention and monitoring of site BMPs.

As stated above, it is the Town's goal to implement a more electronic inspection reporting system in the upcoming year. Also, refer to the C.6 Construction Site Control section of CCCWP's FY 21-22 Annual Report for a description of activities at the countywide or regional level.

LID and construction BMP training has always been helpful each year. In addition, the Town has begun to implement a program to re-visit how construction projects turn out after they are built. Planning and Engineering staff were invited to a group visit of a project site after it was built to see what issues we did good and what we could have done better.

N/A there was no increase in use of these pesticides.

IPM Tactics and Strategies Used:

Town landscape contractors continue to follow wind and temperature guidelines. They also use fewer toxic pesticides from the approved School District list, which follows the Healthy School Act requirements as directed by the Town.

Trapping for rodents, like gophers, moles and voles is the Town’s preferred method. For ground squirrels specifically, the populations have been reduced due to monthly inspections and staying on top of the populations. As a result, eradication is less necessary to control these populations.

The pond located at Oak Hill Park is maintained using natural methods for water quality. A freeze-dried microbe is used to minimize algae growth naturally.

Alum (made from kelp) treatments are used to clear the water quality. The alum removes the suspension in the water and allows all debris to drop to the bottom of the pond which are then consumed by the microbes, while producing water and oxygen. It has become an exact science on how much to use to balance the pond’s ecosystem. The Town has successfully been utilizing this type of natural algae control for approximately 24 years under the direction of the same Town staff person who oversees maintaining the pond’s delicate ecosystem. He oversees a licensed aquatic contractor to perform weekly maintenance and applications as needed. The pond is also equipped with an efficient aeration pump system with five air stones at the bottom of the pond and fountain system that works hand in hand with the microbe treatments to maintain clear water quality and enhanced microbial activity. An UV light system is used, and filter continue to effectively treat the water and kill 99.9% of bacteria that maybe in the water.

Summary:

The Town's CCCSD commercial/industrial inspections include identification of potential sources and uses of copper. Copper sources and adequacy of BMPs are evaluated during all commercial/industrial inspections. Vehicle service facilities that conduct brake service are routinely inspected for management of copper brake pads and the fine solids that are generated when servicing brakes. Vehicle washing operations are routinely evaluated to ensure the wastewater does not enter the storm drain system to control a variety of pollutants including copper. The Enforcement Response Plan elements are used when inadequate controls are identified. Inspectors are also trained to identify reduction BMPs as listed in the BASMAA POC inspector training material

Summary:

The installation of a Central Irrigation System for Town of Danville parks and roadsides continues to be an important tool in the Town’s commitment to reducing over-watering. Phase 1 of the central irrigation system focused on the five major parks (Osage Station, Sycamore Valley, Diablo Vista, Oak Hill and Hap Magee Ranch) and was completed in Spring of 2013. Phase II was completed in the Spring of 2015 and included smaller park sites as well as large turf areas along the roadsides. The Town continues to work with EBMUD to identify water requirements for Town-maintained areas. The Town utilizes EBMUD’s Water Smart Program as well as the information that has been provided on the water billings to check water usage. The information provided by the water bills helps to show usage from year to year and what is the recommended water usage for that area based on plant type. This information is used to make proper irrigation adjustments for a better and efficient irrigation system. The Town uses daily Evapo-transpiration (ET) rate information to adjust the watering schedules at 33 irrigated sites. The Town uses the ET information to make seasonal and weather-related water adjustments. Additionally, the Town is testing new technology that uses underground soil moisture sensors to irrigate based on exactly how much water the site needs.

The Town also has an on-going program to identify areas where either drought tolerant or native plant material could potentially replace plant material that require more water. Every year, as the budget allows, the Town gradually continues to replace landscaping with drought tolerant species when approved by the Town Council. The Town has also eliminated turf in some areas and has bark mulched these areas to help reduce water usage and eliminate chemical use entirely. Grass has been removed from all Town-maintained medians to reduce water and chemical usage.

Through the CCCWP, Danville promotes and implements several programs and measures to minimize pollutant loading from excess irrigation. For example, the Stormwater C.3 Guidebook which Danville adopted by ordinance, encourages land development professionals to design landscaping to: 1) minimize irrigation and runoff; 2) promote infiltration of runoff where appropriate; and, 3) minimize use of fertilizers and pesticides using pest-resistant plants that are suited to site conditions (e.g., soil and climate). The Town is utilizing its ordinance based on the states Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance (MWELO) to continue its efforts for water consumption reduction reducing turf dominated landscapes and more water efficient landscapes

1000 Sherburne Road, Danville, CA

Facility Contact: Jim Parke, Supervisor Maintenance Services

Mr. Jim Parke reported no changes since the last inspection.

Town of Danville Facility Maintenance Center has several buildings.

1. The front building is a two-story edifice. It only has administrative offices.

Facility Maintenance Center (corporation yard) includes vehicle wash area, the area is connected to an oil-sand interceptor, landscape equipment area, vehicle parking areas, concrete bays area, and material storage areas.

2. Shop Building (Vehicle Maintenance Building)

There is a vehicle maintenance building, located in the middle of the property. In the past the building was used as a vehicle maintenance/repair shop, including floor washing activities.

The building is adjacent to the vehicle wash area.

There are three separate rooms in the building.

First room - The first room has a floor trench type and it is connected to the oil-sand interceptor. The room is mainly used for storage. There is no washing or maintenance activities in here.

Second room - Tools and small equipment are stored in the second room. There are no floor drains in here.

Third room - The third room is used to store supplies, such as small cans of paint, signs, and other landscape maintenance supplies; some gym equipment is stored in here.

The shop building rooms are clean, dry, and no sign of washing or auto-mechanical activities.

Mr. Parke emphasized that no washing, maintenance, or repair operations of any kind is done in this area. The building is used for storage only.

ACE Auto shop located in the city of San Ramon makes all necessary repairs and vehicle maintenance. No maintenance of any kind is done at the corporation yard. No hazardous waste is generated in here.

3. Wash Pad Area

A wash pad area is located on the south side of the shop building.

The wash pad area connects to the oil-sand interceptor.

The inspection of the oil-sand interceptor showed little accumulation of solids and no thick oily layer was observed. There is variance on file to clean the interceptor every 6 months.

Facility has an oil-sand interceptor maintenance variance (every 6 months).

The wash pad area has no roof. It has a drain. To protect the sanitary sewer from rainwater infiltration a rubber drain mat is used to cover and seal the drain during rainfall events.

There is a written procedure of how to use the rubber mat. The procedure is posted on the wall of the shop building, adjacent of the wash pad area.

Mr. Parke said, "Only the exterior of the police cars and some city vehicles are washed in this wash pad area."

No car engine cleaning, or mechanical parts cleaning is done.

4. Gas and Diesel Pumps Area.

This area is close to the shop building.

There are two underground storage tanks in this area.

The first is a 10,000-gal gasoline tank and the second one is a 8,000 gal diesel tank.

There are two pump stations, one for diesel and one for gasoline. The area has a concrete floor. The area has no roof.

A spill kit is available in this area. Mr. Parke said that in case of spill a dry granules absorbent is available and the dirty absorbent will be disposed as hazardous waste. No accidents or spills to report, said Mr. Parke.

5. Yard Area

There are about six concrete bays; there is no roof.

The bays are used to store bark, mulch, asphalt, and soil.

Routine inspections are done prior to the rainy season to ensure that non-storm water discharges enter the storm drain system.

The bays are covered with tarp during raining events.

There is a concrete diversion channel on east side of the yard (bottom of the hill.)

It reduces the amount of sediment and runoff entering the yard. The channel is managed by Contra Costa County Flow Control.

During raining season, berms are installed to prevent sediment or runoff into the yard. All the storm drains are protected from sediments. Sand-rock bags are placed around the storm drains. Filter linen is placed inside the storm drains.

Facility has routinely large dumpsters mainly to collect green waste. When needed an extra dumpster is kept on site to manage extra green waste.

Maintenance crews collect small quantity of garbage during street cleaning.

6. Close to the entrance, there are several 20 feet containers; and they are used for storage supplies only. The yard was clean and free of debris.

7. Hazardous Waste Storage.

Two hard roll-top pallet units are used to store hazardous waste. The units are made of rugged-polyethylene material and they will not rust or corrode.

The units keep rainwater out, protecting the drums from the elements and protecting the yard from spills or leaks.

Each unit stores one or two 55-gallon drums. The units provide inside spill containment. The units are in front of the vehicle maintenance building.

At the time of the inspection, only small amount of latex paint was storage in the area.

Mr. Parke said that, maintenance workers occasionally collect small quantities of hazardous waste from car accidents and/or abandoned waste on the street.

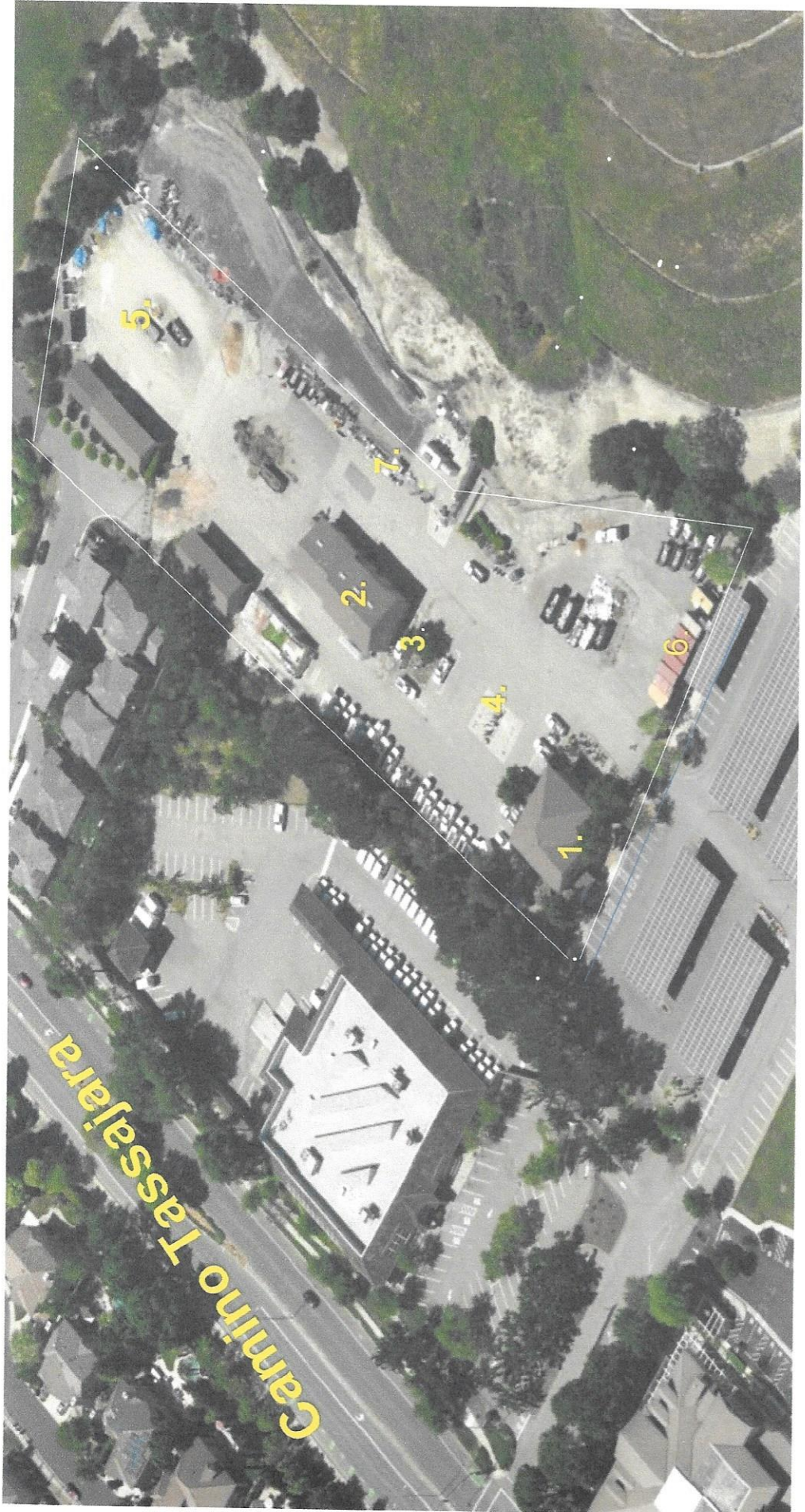
ACE Auto in the city of San Ramon is doing all maintenance and repairs. No oil, brake fluids, antifreeze, or any petroleum wastes are generated in this location.

The rest of the buildings are used for storage and open parking spaces.

Storm drains are dry and free of debris.

No pesticides are used, and no pesticides are storage in the facility.

Facility is following storm water regulations and pretreatment guidelines. It is in compliance with both the storm water and pretreatment regulations

C.3 Planning, Design, Construction, and Maintenance of Low Impact Development Features and Facilities Workshop

CCCWP sponsored a Provision C.3 Compliance Workshop, “Planning, Design, Construction, and Maintenance of Low Impact Development Features and Facilities,” held on May 24, 2022. This was initially scheduled as an in-person workshop to be held in Walnut Creek, but was switched to a webinar due to on-going public health concerns. There were 159 registrants and about 140-145 participated in the online seminar. Slightly more than half the attendees are engineers or engineering technicians working for consulting firms or land development companies that prepare LID designs for development. Somewhat less than half were engineers, planners, architects, and inspectors working for stormwater NPDES permittees. About 45% of participants had previously attended a CCCWP C.3 workshop.

Presentations included a review of the basics of Provision C.3 compliance and Low Impact Development design, an update on changes to Provision C.3 in MRP 3.0, and a brief training on Green Infrastructure project identification and preliminary design techniques. As with previous years’ workshops, the presentations were followed by a panel made up of experienced municipal stormwater staff: Mitra Abkenari (City of Concord), Phil Hoffmeister (City of Antioch), Frank Kennedy (Kennedy and Associates), and Ryan Cook (Walnut Creek). The panelists led an interactive discussion of five key topics in LID implementation.

Upon exiting the Zoom webinar, participants were asked to answer four questions to provide feedback. 25 responses were received. The responses were entirely positive.

The workshop agenda and slides have been posted to the CCCWP website. The webinar was recorded, and a link to the recording is also on the CCCWP website.

C.4 Stormwater Inspector Training Workshop

The CCCWP hosted one Commercial/Industrial Stormwater Inspection Training Workshop in FY 2021/22. Due to the ongoing coronavirus pandemic, the workshop was held on June 22, 2022, via a Zoom webinar. The workshop had 25 attendees and topics consisted of:

- Stormwater Regulatory Overview of C.4/C.5 Under MRP 3.0;
- Investigating Cross Connections in Storm Water;
- Addressing Encampments of Unsheltered Homeless;
- Enforcement & Coordination with the County District Attorney;

Recordings of the presentation were made available to Permittees and their inspectors following the completion of the workshop.

C.6.f - Construction Inspector Training

To assist Contra Costa Permittees to comply with MRP Provision C.6.f.ii., CCCWP sponsors training for permittee construction inspection staff biennially. The previous biennial training was in FY 2019/20. The FY 2021/22 training was held on March 30, 2022, jointly with the Alameda County Clean Water Program (ACCWP). The workshop was attended by 133 municipal agency staff and 11 consultants. The training was held virtually, on the *GoTo Training* platform; it was recorded and made available to ACCWP and CCCWP members.

The presentations provided foundational C.6 information, pending updates to the Construction General Permit (CGP) and the MRP, and inspection case studies. The inspection case studies drew from experiences three presenting stormwater construction inspectors and was followed up with an extended panel discussion with the participants.

Pre- and post-workshop surveys provided insights into the knowledge of the participants before and after the workshop. The pre-workshop survey had an average correct response rating of 70% that improved to 81% in the post-workshop survey.

Participants were also asked to provide feedback on the Workshop. Seventy-two percent of the attendees (104 out of 143) completed evaluations. Approximately 50% of the

attendees stated a preference for future online trainings with the remaining 50% split between no preference and in-person trainings.

The survey also asked “What C.6 questions did you wish were covered, or were not covered enough in this workshop? These responses, which help to identify future training topics and needs, included: additional information on enforcement tools and options for non-responsive contractors; overview of inspection forms and other tools available for inspectors; Water Board contacts; clarification on CGP disturbance thresholds and comparison to MRP C.6 requirements; review of small project Erosion Control Plans.

Enclosed is the invoice and backup documentation from Central San, West County Wastewater District (WCWD), and Delta Diablo for the fourth quarter (April 1, 2022, through June 30, 2022) of the fiscal year 2021-22 Storm Water Inspection Program.

As the quarterly report indicates, 420 inspections that apply toward the annual inspection goal (997 for the fiscal year 2021-22; the annual target for Richmond was reduced as noted below) were completed during the fourth quarter reporting period, representing 111% of the total annual goal. Inspections were completed during the reporting period in all cities participating in the agreement. Also included with this billing packet are the annual summaries for inspections and enforcement actions taken during fiscal year 2021-22. The annual targets were met in all the participating cities. WCWD identified that the City of Richmond staff removed some inspections from their list to conduct those inspections with city staff. The annual target for Richmond was reduced from 16 to 14.

Delta Diablo identified that 5 inspections were completed in October 2021 that were omitted from the second quarter report. The annual summary for Antioch includes the omitted inspections, and the cover page of this report also includes the 5 inspections in the inspection total for the 1st through 3rd quarter periods.

A Precious Gem in our Valley

The San Ramon Valley Creek is one of the precious gems of our valley. It provided the essential water for survival for the indigenous people and early immigrants. In 1772, Captain Pedro Fages and Franciscan Padre Juan Crespi trekked from Walnut Creek through the San Ramon Valley and noted that the valley was home to numerous gentle and peaceful indigenous people and seemed to be “a charming site for settlement with much water.” Since the early nineteenth century, ranchers raised cattle and sheep and farmers produced bounteous crops from the fertile soil. As the urban population of the valley grew, the creek changed from a meandering stream with large pools to the channeled and flood-controlled creek we know today. Consequently, this has caused irreparable damage to viable trout and salmon habitat.

Despite intense urbanization, the creek still supports an incredibly diverse ecosystem including the familiar larger animals such as coyotes, deer, and otters, and also fish, insects, and myriad microscopic species living in the mud under the creek. The wet sediment under the creek is called the hyporheic zone and is sometimes referred to as the “liver of the river” meaning it can cleanse pollutants and supply nutrients to the stream. Ecosystems that occur alongside water ways (streams, rivers) are called riparian areas and they play a vital role in our environment. Riparian vegetation can remove excess nutrients and sediment from surface runoff and shallow ground water, shade streams to optimize light and temperature conditions for aquatic plants, fish, and other animals, and also help stabilize stream banks and reduce floodwater velocity.

In urban areas, creek ecosystems are threatened because the creeks are conduits for products such as fertilizers, pesticides, soaps, and oils that get carried into the creek from road, driveway, and garden runoff. Thankfully, our efficient town and county waste disposal system and conscientious citizens protect the creek from much of the obvious visible pollution such as plastic bottles and paper products, but common household chemicals do cause pollution in the creeks, often unknown and unintended by those who use them.

“Friends of San Ramon Creek”, a local group of volunteers, have commenced routine measurements of the creek water to monitor its health. This project is part of a nonprofit Bay Area water quality monitoring program called, “The Watershed Project.”

Our measurement sites stretch from Crow Canyon in San Ramon to Livorna Road in Alamo. We measure temperature, pH, dissolved oxygen levels, nitrate concentration, turbidity, and specific conductivity (an indicator of dissolved material). The quality of the water in the creek is surprisingly good considering the density of the suburban population. The dissolved oxygen concentrations range from 4 to 12 mg/l which is acceptable for most species to survive. To put this in perspective, fresh water at sea level and a temperature of 77F has a saturation dissolved oxygen content of 8.2 mg/l. Oxygen levels vary with temperature, altitude, salinity, and the presence of decaying organic matter. Nitrate concentrations are in the general range of 0.5 to 4.0 mg/l which is below the drinking water standard of a maximum of 10 mg/l. A significant

source of nitrates in the creek is garden fertilize. As any camper knows, even in the high Sierras, humans should not drink any stream water unless it has been treated.

The town of Danville and other County governments are required to report each year on their projects to reduce runoff to the creek as part of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES). Street sweeping is an important activity that reduces the potential for toxic particulates to be carried to the creek by water run-off. Irrigation of the town's parks is carefully monitored. Most new construction must comply with the most recent storm water treatment regulations which often requires inclusion of subsurface filtration systems to filter water run-off from roads, parking lots, and roofs before the water enters the creek.

What can residents do to be good stewards of the creek? Understand the sources and fate of home generated pollutants, particularly what goes into the drains from gardens and driveways. Minimize the use of pesticides, fertilizers, and outdoor use of soaps and other home chemicals. Homeowners whose property borders the creek can maintain their section of the creek's ecosystem by preventing erosion, controlling invasive species such as the bamboo look alike Arundo, and removing trash from the creek. 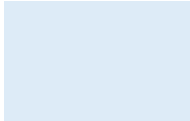
